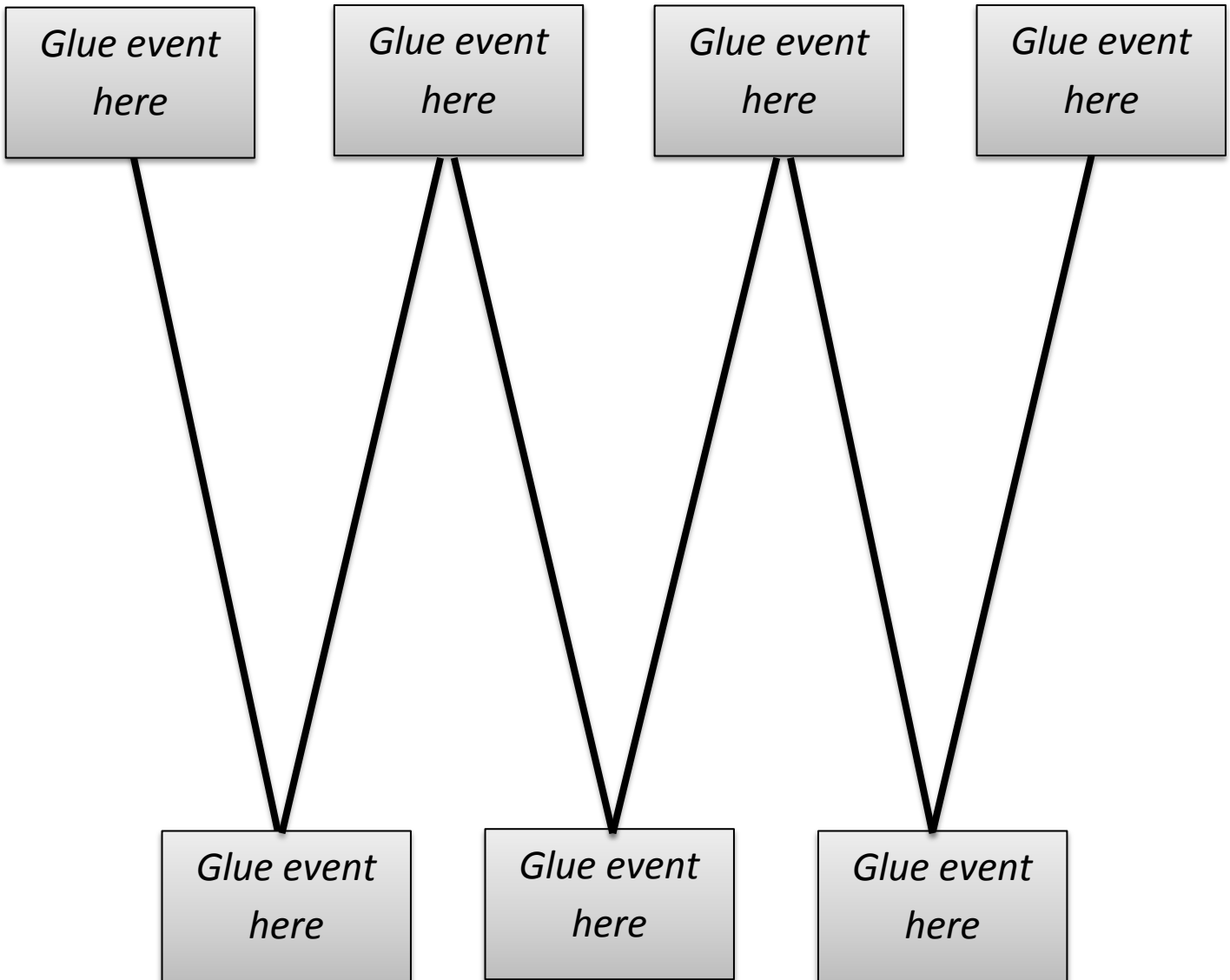

Annie Oakley	Founded the Missionaries of Charity

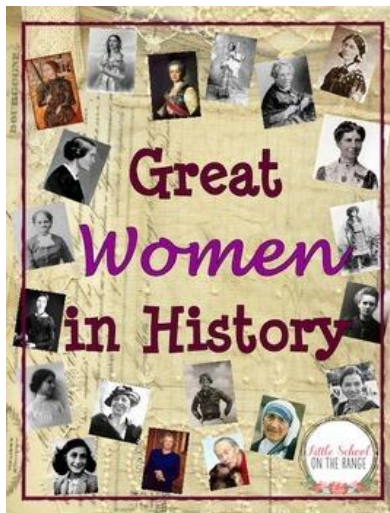
Sacagawea	Her image is on the silver dollar
